Bisphenol S (BPS)	State's Qualified Experts	Female Reproductive	December 29, 2023

Bisphenol S (BPS)	State's Qualified Experts	Developmental (Reproductive)	April 18, 2022
Vinyl Acetate	State's Qualified Experts	Cancer	September 18, 2023
N-Methyl-N-Formylhydrazine	State's Qualified Experts	Cancer	January 10, 2025



Proposed Safe Harbor Levels

Chemical	Safe Harbor	Proposed Level	Date Proposed
Titanium Dioxide	No Significant Risk Level	Both levels apply to any given exposure: 440 µg/day ¹ 44 µg/day ²	June 24, 2024

¹Unbound, airborne particles with diameters of 10 micrometers or less.

²Unbound, airborne particles with diameters of 0.8 micrometers or less.

Amendments to Clear and Reasonable Warnings, Safe Harbor Methods and Content	Effective date - January 1, 2025	
(Cal. Code of Regs., title 27, sections 25601, 25602, 25603, 25607.2 and new sections 25607.50, 25607.51, 25607.52, and 25607.53)	Three-year implementation period of revised short-form warnings through January 1, 2028	



Significant Proposition 65 Litigation

ACTIVE:

- California Chamber of Commerce v. Bonta (Acrylamide warnings for food)
- The Personal Care Products Council v. Bonta (Titanium dioxide (airborne, unbound particles of respirable size) warnings for cosmetic and personal care products)
- Physicians Committee for Responsible Medicine v. Newsom (Processed meat)
